
To date we have sent **450 inflatable globes** and school supplies. Join the GIS community, get involved and Reach Across the World!!!

# Give A Globe Campaign Focus Schools



Sinjar is in Western Ninewa Province, approximately 60 miles west of Mosul and 25 miles east of the Syrian/Iraqi border. Sinjar District is primarily made up of Kurdish and Yezidi people. there are some Arab Sunnis, but they are a clear minority in this district. There are also a few villages that are Turkoman, another small ethnic tribe that has some historical ties to Turkish culture. The Civil Affairs Team was asked by the Sinjar District to assist in helping build/renovate schools.

# SOULK SCHOOL RENOVATION PROJECT

Soulk Village - (pronounced "Soo-lock") . . . (approx. 5 miles east of Sinjar City) - this Yezidi village has approx. 200 kids going to a school made of mud . . . they have morning and afternoon session of classes and really needed a larger facility to teach kids. A brand new 6 classroom cement block school building was built with new desks, blackboards and facilities for the village.

# KHAJOOK SCHOOL RENOVATION PROJECT

Khajook Village - (pronounced "Ka-jook") . . . (approx. 3 miles south of Sinjar City) - this village is primarily Kurdish based, but the school in the village was in extreme need of renovations . . . a contractor was hired who rebuilt the entire school walls, new windows and doors, renovated electrical and installed a water well on the site. This village has 100 kids in the school, however, surrounding small villages also send their children to the school in Khajook. With the newly renovated school building, they expect up to 300 children to attend this primary school.
